

Important Safety Advice

When using electrical appliances, basic precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electrical shock and injury to persons, including the following:

If the appliance is damaged, check with the supplier before installation and operation.

Do not use outdoors.

Do not use in the immediate surroundings of a bath, shower or swimming pool.

Do not locate the appliance immediately below a fixed socket outlet or connection box.

This appliance can be used by children aged form 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by Children without supervision.

Children of less than 3 years should be kept away unless continuously supervised. Children aged from 3 years and less than 8 years shall only switch on/off the appliance provided that it has been placed or installed in its intended normal operating position and they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understanding the hazards involved. Children aged from 3 years and less than 8 years shall not plug in, regulate and clean the appliance or perform user maintenance.

Do not use this appliance in series with a thermal control, a program controller, a timer or any other device that switches on the heat automatically, since a fire risk exists when the appliance is accidentally covered or displaced.

This appliance is not equipped with a device to control the room temperature.

Do not use this appliance in small rooms when they are occupied by persons not capable of leaving the room on their own, unless constant supervision is provided.

Ensure that furniture, curtains or other combustible material are positioned no closer than 1 metre from the appliance.

In the event of a fault unplug the appliance.

Unplug the appliance when not required for long periods.

Although this appliance complies with safety standards, we do not recommend its use on deep pile carpets or on long hair type of rugs.

The appliance must be positioned so that the plug is accessible.

If the supply cord is damaged it must be replaced by the manufacturer or service agent or a similarly qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.

Keep the supply cord away from the front of the appliance.

Warning: In order to avoid overheating, do not cover the appliance. Do not place material or garments on the appliance, or obstruct the air circulation around the appliance, for instance by curtains or furniture, as this could cause overheating and a fire risk.

Warning: In order to avoid a hazard due to inadvertent resetting of the thermal cut-out, this appliance must not be supplied through an external switching device, such as a timer, or connected to a circuit that is regularly switched on and off by the utility.

CAUTION - Some parts of this product can become very hot and cause burns. Particular attention has to be given where children and vulnerable people are present.

General

Unpack the heater carefully and retain the packaging for possible future use, in the event of moving or returning the fire to your supplier.

The fire incorporates a flame effect, which can be used with or without heating, so that the comforting effect may be enjoyed at any time of the year. Using the flame effect on its own only requires little electricity. These models are designed to be free standing and are normally positioned against a wall.

Before connecting the heater check that the supply voltage is the same as that stated on the heater.

Please note: Used in an environment where background noise is very low, it may be possible to hear a sound which is related to the operation of the flame effect. This is normal and should not be a cause for concern.

Electrical connection

WARNING - THIS APPLIANCE MUST BE EARTHED.

This heater must be used on an AC ~ supply only and the voltage marked on the heater must correspond to the supply voltage.

Before switching on, please read the safety warnings and operating instructions.

Controls - see Fig. 2

Switch 1 Controls the electricity supply to the heater and flame effect. Note: This switch must be in the ON position for heater to operate with or without heat.

Switch 2 Turns the heat ON/OFF.

Thermostat (T) - see Fig. 2

In order to maintain your desired room temperature, set the controller T to 'max.'. Operate the appliance on maximum heat until the required room temperature is reached. Turn the thermostatic controller away from the max setting until the heat switches off with an audible "click". The chosen temperature will be kept almost constant by the thermostatic control switching on and off automatically. Please note that the thermostat switches the heating element on and off; the fan motor runs continuously when the heater has been selected using switch 2. Please also note that when the heater is switched on, the thermostat will only activate the heating element if the selected thermostat setting is higher than the actual room temperature.

Thermal Safety Cut-out

A thermal safety cut-out is incorporated in the heater to prevent damage due to overheating. This can happen if the heat outlet was restricted in any way. The heater will switch on once the obstruction has been removed and the heater has cooled. If the cut-out continues to operate intermittently, the heater should be switched off and a service agent contacted.

Maintenance

WARNING: ALWAYS DISCONNECT FROM THE POWER SUPPLY **BEFORE ATTEMPTING ANY MAINTENANCE.**

Light Emitting Diode

This fire is fitted with LED (Light Emitting Diode) bulbs in place of conventional bulbs . These generate the same light levels as conventional bulbs, but use a fraction of the energy consumed. These LED bulbs are maintenance - free and will not require replacing during the life of the product.

Cleaning

WARNING - ALWAYS DISCONNECT FROM THE POWER SUPPLY **BEFORE CLEANING THE HEATER.**

For general cleaning use a soft clean duster - never use abrasive cleaners. The glass viewing screen should be cleaned carefully with a soft cloth. DO NOT use proprietary glass cleaners.

To remove any accumulation of dust or fluff the soft brush attachment of a vacuum cleaner should occasionally be used to clean the outlet grille of the fan heater.

Wall fixing - see Fig. 3

The appliance should be fixed to the wall using the chain, wall plug and screw supplied.

Place the appliance in its intended location, mark the centre and top edge of the appliance with a pencil on the wall.

Remove the appliance to a safe place.

Continue the centre line down towards the floor, mark the wall 100mm below the top mark.

Drill the wall and insert the wall plug, bring back the appliance and locate it away from the wall but allow it close enough to the wall to allow the chain to reach the wall, pass the screw provided through a link in the chain which sits infront of the wall plug and screw the screw into the wall plug. Push the product up against the wall.

Note - for studded walls special fasteners are required.

Remove wall fixing before attempting any maintenance.

Recycling
